

## MULTIMEDIA PRESENTATION/Research Guidelines

### PART 1:

You are going to choose a nonfiction book and do a mini-research project. You will read and take notes. After perusing the book you chose, decide on 2 main categories/topic areas that you can report on.

For instance, say you chose a book on Dak Prescott, the football player. After looking through your book, you decide that you are going to report on the following 2 topics about Dak Prescott:

1. High School Years
2. College Years
3. Pro Career

You will read your book and take notes (in your journal) on these 3 areas of his life. Look for interesting/important information about those 3 areas. You may also use reputable websites on the internet to gather your information.

Source Information: You will make a bibliography so BE SURE to keep notes on the book name, author, pages, etc. that you use (see back page for info needed for bibliography.)

**\*\*You may not plagiarize, which means you may not copy directly from the book or website. You must write your notes in your own words. Your notes will be checked!\*\***

*YOU MAY NOT TAKE THE BOOKS OUT OF THE ROOM BECAUSE THEY ARE BEING SHARED BETWEEN ALL CLASSES.*

### PART 2:

You will plan and produce a multimedia presentation involving text and graphics using technology. You may choose from:

- Powerpoint Presentation
- Prezi Presentation

**\*\*Be sure to include both text and graphics in your presentation. \*\***

Plan a minimum of 5 slides in your presentation.

**Slide 2:** Topic 1

**Slide 3:** Topic 2

**Slide 4:** Topic 3

**Slide 5:** Bibliography (see back page)
